Ministry of Mines National Mineral Exploration Trust Minutes of 41st Executive Committee (EC) meeting, NMET held on 11.3.2025 Venue: Khanij Kaksh, Shastri Bhawan

The 41st meeting of Executive Committee (EC) of NMET was held under Chairmanship of Shri V. L. Kantha Rao, Secretary, Mines/Chairman EC on 11th March, 2025 at Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi in hybrid mode. The list of participants is given in Annexure-1. Shri Vivek Kumar Bajpai, Joint Secretary/Member Secretary, EC welcomed the chairman EC, all members, technical experts and invitees in the meeting. The points discussed and decisions taken in the meeting are as under:

Agenda 41.1: Confirmation of minutes of 40th Meeting of EC held on 21st February, 2025.

The minutes of the 40th EC meeting were circulated on 28th February, 2025. No comments received from the members.

Decision: EC confirmed the minutes of the 40th meeting of Executive Committee (EC).

Agenda 41.2: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the minutes of 40th EC meeting

EC was briefed on the action taken on decisions taken during the 40th EC meeting. Discussion on the actionable points is given as under:-

i. In the matter of organizing a workshop on EL regime, EC instructed that the workshop be organized in the month of April, 2025.

[Action: NMET]

ii. Regarding the surveillance assessment reports of NPEAs by QCI Nabet, the representatives of QCI-Nabet apprised EC that out of 16 NPEAs, assessment of 12 NPEAs have been carried out and assessment of rest of the 4 NPEAs is pending. EC instructed QCI-Nabet to (a) fast track the mid-term assessment of rest of the NPEAs and submit the assessment report to Ministry of Mines, (b) to develop a mechanism to carry out timely mid-term surveillance assessment and reassessment of NPEAs after completion of accreditation period of 03 years so that appropriate action may be taken against the non performing NPEAs, (c) make a calendar for

initiating mid-term surveillance assessment and reassessment of NPEAs well before the completion of 18 months and 03 years since accreditation and share the calender with Ministry of Mines and NMET Secretariat and (d) share the deficiencies observed with respect to the performance of NPEAs with Ministry of Mines and NMET Secretariat for initiating timely corrective measures.

[Action: MINES-I/QCI-Nabet]

iii. As regards the auction of Bhatikheda block, MECL informed the house that they have received a brief note concerning the "Geological Report on Exploration carried out for Atomic Minerals, REE (including Yttrium, Niobium, and associated elements) around the Bhatikhera Area, Siwana Ring Complex, Balotra (formerly Barmer) district, Rajasthan" from AMD and they have requested AMD to provide the detailed GR including annexures, plates, bore hole details etc. so that the block can be put up for auction.

EC instructed MECL to convene a meeting with AMD in next 10 days and fast track the evaluation of report so that the block can be put up for auction at the earliest.

iv. Regarding uploading of reports of NMET funded exploration projects on NGDR portal, EC was informed that 205 reports have already been uploaded on NGDR portal and rest of the 29 reports would be uploaded by end of March, 2025.

EC instructed Director (Tech.) to follow up with GSI and ensure that the reports are uploaded on time.

[Action: NMET/Director (Tech.)]

v. Regarding the evaluation of report submitted by the committee on "Inclusion of seismic survey in coal exploration", EC was apprised that the comments of Ministry of Coal have been forwarded to the committee. The committee was accordingly directed to finalize the report within 31.3.2025 and share the same with NMET Secretariat.

vi. As regards circulation of SoP to explore critical minerals/ other minerals associated with coal and to issue a letter to CMPDIL to look for critical minerals/other minerals in the dumps and tailings of coal mines, MoC informed that they will decide on SoP for exploration possibility of other minerals in all the coal mines after stakeholder consultation.

[Action: MoC]

vii. Regarding the assessment of 2,600 geological reports submitted by various State Governments for their geological potential, EC was informed that 212 reports have been shortlisted for evaluation. Of these, 110 reports have already been assessed, while the remaining 102 will be evaluated by the end of March, 2025. Director (Tech.) stated that on basis of evaluation of the 110 reports, 27 blocks are suitable for auction, while 51 blocks are upgradable.

The EC instructed that a meeting be convened in first week of April, 2025 to discuss the outcome of all 212 projects and to determine the way forward.

viii. As regards adopting the methodology of CGM, Gujarat to enhance mineral exploration activity in the other states, EC was apprised that a letter has been sent to all the states to adopt the good initiative of CGM, Gujarat.
EC advised that on the analogy of CGM, Gujarat, MECL can assist other States in adopting such methodology to enhance mineral exploration activity in respective

States.

ix. Regarding participation of NPEAs in the auction of bulk minerals in respect of blocks explored by them, EC was apprised that NPEAs can participate only in the auction of critical and deep seated minerals, as per Rule 24, sub rule (2) of the Mineral (Auction) Amendment Rules, 2024.

EC directed to examine and review the matter whether NPEAs be allowed to take part in the auction of bulk minerals in respect of blocks explored by them.

[Action: Policy Section and NMET]

 Regarding joint visit to Khongka limestone block of Nagaland, EC was apprised that a committee constituting members from IBM, GSI and MECL has been constituted. The committee will visit the area in the third week of March, 2025 and will submit a report by 31.3.2025 on the commercial viability of Composite License at G-4 stage or whether the block can be upgraded to G-3 stage of investigation.

[Action: Committee Members]

xi. (a) As regards uploading the results/outcome of hackathon of GSI in NGDR portal, EC was apprised that the outcome of the hackathon has been published on NGDR portal on 6.3.2025. Further, regarding maximizing the participation of agencies in the training program schedule to be held on 17th March, 2023, EC was apprised that already 38 agencies have confirmed their participation and due to such extensive participation, the training may be conducted in two batches.

(b) Dr. S. Ravi, Chairman, TCC-1 informed the house that several NPEAs are interested to attend field training conducted by GSITI, Hyderabad to enhance their technical capabilities.

EC instructed that a policy/scheme may be formulated to provide financial support to the NPEAs from NMET fund to take field training at GSITI, Hyderabad in order to enhance the technical competence of the geologists of NPEAs.

(c) As regards the upcoming Hackathon event at Goa on 13th March, 2025, EC advised DG, GSI to communicate with various agencies, Start-up companies in and around Goa to participate in the event.

Agenda 41.3: Approval for constitution of committee to review the Schedule of Charges of various components of projects funded through NMET.

EC was apprised that the Schedule of Charges (SoC) of NMET for various components of exploration projects came into effect from 1.4.2020 for a period of 5 years and its validity will end on 31.3.2025.

During these last 5 years several modern tools/technologies like drone based surveys, application of AI-ML platforms, application of radiogenic, stable isotopic data etc., have gained traction in the mineral prospecting and exploration projects and these components need to be included in the present SoC. Further, at the time of framing of SoC there was no private exploration agency in the country and its structure needs to be reviewed accordingly.

In this regard, the proposal was submitted to constitute a committee to review and update the existing SoC of NMET and also to extend the validity of the existing SoC for 08 more months, till the approval of new SoC.

Decision of EC: EC accorded the approval to review and update the existing SoC by constituting a committee. EC also approved the validity of the existing SoC for further 08 months.

Agenda 41.4: Proposal for payment of Exploration Incentive for upgradation of blocks from G-4 to G-3 stage of investigation [Agency: MECL]

EC was apprised that MECL has upgraded 04 projects from G4 stage to G3 stage and has requested for an Exploration Incentive (EI) of 25% of the approved cost in pursuance of the NMET scheme (OM 6/2/2015-NMET/237 dt. 3rd September, 2023).

TCC-2 in its 6th meeting evaluated the proposal and observed that the approved expenditure for 04 blocks is Rs. 3.46 crore, however, the actual expenditure incurred on the

projects is Rs. 3.23 crore. Therefore, TCC-2 recommended the proposal of MECL for providing exploration incentive of 25% of the actual expenditure incurred towards the exploration of 04 blocks amounting to Rs. 0.81 crore to EC.

Decision of EC: EC accorded financial approval of ₹0.81 crore (Rupees eighty one lakhs) to MECL towards upgradation of mineral exploration blocks from G4 to G3 stage of investigation.

EC was apprised that based upon the recommendations of 60th TCC meeting held on 27th and 28th December, 2023, the Executive Committee of NMET at its 33rd meeting had

accorded approval for procurement of 04 instruments with an approved cost of Rs. 32.44 crore with time duration of 12 months to MECL. The details of the sanctioned equipments are given below:

Further, EC had decided that NMET will not bear the cost of AMC for more than three years after warranty of one year and MECL will have to bear the AMC cost thereafter.

MECL in the 74th meeting of Technical-cum-Cost Committee-1 informed that they had received L-1 bidder price of ₹1728.77 lakh for one Hyperspectral core scanner with XRF unit which includes a 3-year CAMC and 18%GST and L-1 bidder price of ₹2574.20 lakhs for one Core scanner with LIBS unit which includes a 3 -year Extended Warranty (as CAMC), GST and other taxes like custom duty, landing charges etc. The detailed price break up of the instruments is given below in Table-A and B:

Hence, MECL has submitted a proposal to consider the cost escalation of **Rs. 4.20 crore and Rs. 3.71 crore** with respect to earlier sanctioned amount for **Hyperspectral core scanner with XRF** including 3 years CAMC and 18%GST and **Core scanner with LIBS** including 3 years extended warranty as CAMC, GST and other taxes like custom duty, landing charges etc., respectively. The overall escalation in the earlier sanctioned amount for both the instruments is Rs. 7.91 crore.

Chairman, TCC-1 apprised the EC that MECL had floated the tenders with specifications for Hyperspectral Core Scanner with XRF and Core Scanner with LIBS whereas approval by NMET was accorded for Hyperspectral Core Scanner with XRF and Hyperspectral Core Scanner with LIBS. As the instrument is unique of its kind and will be purchased for the first time in India, TCC-1 in its 74th meeting recommended the following for approval of EC:

 Revised cost for Hyperspectral Core Scanner with XRF at ₹ 17.29 crore inclusive of GST and 3 years CAMC and Core Scanner with LIBS at ₹ 25.75 crore inclusive of GST, other taxes like custom duty, landing charges and three-year extended warranty/CAMC. 18 month timeline extension up to 30th September, 2026 for completion of procurement of the instruments- Core Scanner with LIBS & Hyper Spectral Core Scanner with XRF.

Decision of EC: EC instructed that the proposal be first got examined by IFD, Mines and if concurred by IFD, the file be put up for approval.

Shri LS Shekhawat, Technical Expert informed that anomalous value of Scandium is observed in red balls of Deccan Trap near Pune Sector and anomalous value of Vanadium is observed in Anatri area of Andhra Pradesh (based on scientific publication). These areas can be taken up for further exploration.

EC advised that these areas should be initially evaluated by GSI and thereafter based on the GSI recommendations, further exploration can be taken up.
